

Hazekamp shows cattle at the local and national levels. Currently, C&C Farms has 70 head of Angus cattle.

**PJ Trowbridge, Vice President -** At the forefront of the Angus breed, Trowbridge Angus remains a showcase of quality purebred livestock. PJ plays a vital role on the farm. Trowbridge received his degree from SUNY Cobleskill in Animal Science, and is a very integral part of the operation, from crops to cattle to machinery.

**Jerry Emerich, Treasurer -** Jerry currently serves as Treasurer of the NY Angus Association. Over the last several years, he has served on the Board of Directors, as Vice-President and as President. In 2024 he was awarded the Distinguished Service Award by NYAA.

Jerry hails from western Ohio, growing up on a small dairy farm. He graduated from The Ohio State University in 1982 with a BS degree in Dairy Science. He has been employed within the Select Sires, Inc. federation since graduation. Early in his career with Select Sires, Jerry worked predominately in International Marketing, having traveled and worked in 23 countries around the

world. His main responsibilities included providing herd genetic consultation to both dairy and beef producers. In 1993, Jerry relocated to the northeastern USA as Select Sires expanded their marketing efforts there.



His responsibilities included coordinating genetic programs in eastern NY and in the New England states. He also continued to travel abroad for Select Sires until the northeastern territory merged into Select Sire Power, a member co-op of Select Sires in 2000. Later, in 2018 merging with another member co-op,

he is now employed by Premier Select Sires, Inc. In 2009, Jerry was named one of the first Select Sires Beef Specialists, providing genetic and reproduction consultation services to beef producers in New York and New England.

Jerry and his wife Wanda were married in 1996. Wanda is the Dairy Outreach and Education Coordinator for the WH Miner Agriculture Research Institute, a private education and research facility located in Chazy, NY. Having first lived in Fairfield, VT they relocated to Mooers, NY in 2009 where they own and operate a 59 acre farm. Their daughter Katarina graduated from Purdue University in 2021 and currently resides in Madison, WI where she is employed by Semex, USA. The Emerich's raise both Angus and Jersey cattle. The Angus and the Jersey heifers are raised at home with the Jersey cows located on a farm in New Hampshire. The focus of their Angus herd is to breed for total performance with one of their proudest accomplishments being the breeder of Dorado N Augustus E182 at Select Sires.

After living in Iowa for nearly 10 years, Gabby returned home to the farm in late 2021. Her passion for Angus cattle spans 25 years, owning her first Angus cattle in 1998.

She officially launched GabbyG.Co in October 2023. My experience working for Sullivan Supply's The Pulse, Pearl's Pics, and the Coalition to Support Iowa's Farmers primarily influenced my career in photography and graphic design.

Joe Mueller III, Director - Joe owns and operates Rocky Bend Angus alongside his father and grandfather. Their farm is located in Jamesville, NY, and was established in 1919. They currently calve around 50 head a year, retaining 10 steers a year for direct-to-consumer beef sales out of their sweet corn stand. Mueller is a 5th generation farmer part time, and works full time as a surveyor for JK Tobin Construction. Rocky Bend Angus started as a dairy with an in-house pasteurizer and bottler. His great grandfather would bring the milk by horse and buggy into the city of Syracuse. In 1940,

they sold the dairy herd and equipment to The Cornell Dairy. From then on, they bred and sold registered Holsteins until finally transitioning to beef cattle in 2013. They currently grow sweet corn and field corn, and grow hay - baling around 500 round bales (most for balage) and 2,000 small squares for horses (and to keep grandfather busy).

Joe met his beautiful wife Lindsey, an Alfred State Grad, at JK Tobin Construction. Lindsey is currently employed at Lockheed Martin. Joe and Lindsey have been happily married for three years and have been blessed with two wonderful children, Natalie and Joseph.

"We are extremely lucky we get to bring our children up in the amazing Angus industry with incredible people behind it", they stated. "Our daughter Natalie is almost two and she loves Angus cows even more than her dad. I can't wait for the day I see her in the show ring as part of the Junior Angus Association."



As a kid, Joe was always at the barn feeding bottle calves, planting corn, and raking hay, but his true passion was always the cows. As a little boy, he remembers watching the hay being cut on their farm and thinking that it was so awesome. He started

learning to farm as a child and loved it. From learning how to run equipment, care for animals, mend almost anything with baling twine, to checking to see if the hay was dry enough to bale, he knew this was going to be part of his life forever.

In high school he served as President, Secretary, and Treasurer for Sidney FFA. He was also very active in Boy Scouts of America and achieved his Eagle Scout in 1992. While in high school, he bought his first black Angus from Mormon Hollow Farms in Masonville, New York. This began his cow-calf operation of now 30 years.

Hinkley graduated early from SUNY Cobleskill in December 1997 with a bachelor's degree in agriculture. His internship was on a Red Deer farm in Ashland, New

Hampshire. During his internship, he was inspired, and his dream was to raise Elk. In the Summer of 1997, he started building his dream and raised registered Elk for six years. The chronic wasting disease scare was the end of that dream and it put him out of business.

Still raising his small herd of black Angus and commercial cows, in December of 2001 he started his own insurance agency specializing in farm insurance. Even though farming was and still is his passion, he also has a calling for protecting and caring for people, their families, and their farms.


"My wife and I currently have a small herd of registered black angus. Our goal is to improve the genetics of our herd and this breed. Breeding for quality beef and a better all-around animal."

### GOLDSTANDARD **SINCE 1935**

ANKONY ANGUS

Ankony Angus was founded in 1935 by New York businessman, Allan Ryan. Ryan was Chairman of the board of the company his grandfather had founded in 1904 - Royal Typewriter Company. This practical man was dedicated to excellence in all endeavors. His purchase of 10 Briarcliff Angus heifers from his neighbor, Myron Fuerst, in the midst of the depression for \$150 each, initiated a shot that has echoed around the cattle world for the last six decades.



Ryan formed a partnership with Lee Leachman in 1948. The partnership formed between the two men a year later set the stage for a purebred operation never before seen in Angus history.

From the start, the Ankony breeding program became a lesson study in animal genetics and management. The cow herd grew to a collection of unparalleled productive cow families from which the top end were never priced, sold or shown.

Ankony bulls came to be looked upon as individuals with their own identity, description and uniqueness. The prefix "Ankonian" became synonymous with herd bull power, transmitting individuality as well as value to their progeny.

CHICAGO **INTERNATIONAL** During the 1950s, 60s and 70s, the Chicago International became the Ankony display case. Easily the world's most competitive andmeaningful Angus show, Ankony bulls laid claim to more championships and class winners in this prestigious show than the next threecompetitors combined.

Ankony's show ring achievements were rivaled only by corresponding results in the sale ring. Ankony's sales were record setting events asleading breeders from throughout the world eagerly sought to own the Ankony product.

**ANKONY FARMS** 

In the summer of 1966, shocking news hit the press - Allan Rvan and Lee Leachman would dissolve their partnership with the Ankony dispersion scheduled for October 13, 14 and 15. But prior to that breaking news, the owners of Ankony and master breeder Myron Fuerst were working out a plan for the Ankony name and its famous tradition to carry on. Seeing the need to be closer to the exploding expansion of the breed in the western states, Ankony purchased the Clayton Jennings' Hyland Angus Ranch near Highmore, S.D.




As expected, the Ankony dispersion shattered all sales records, grossing over \$2.6 million on 66 bulls and 580 females. The event was a fittingtribute to men who had dreamed the impossible dream in the Angus cattle genetics and achieved their goal.

Now it was time to meet new challenges. The Ankony herd felt right at home in the West. The Ankony show herd continued the winningtradition with several successful outings at the National Western Stock Show, claiming championships both on the hill and in the yards.

Performance became the order of the day. Ankony began weighing all calves at birth, weaning and yearling, initiating one of the most complete information systems in the beef industry. The serious business of cattle breeding became even more intense at Ankony as they sensed the need for change to meet industry needs. Commercial men were demanding larger framed, more efficient cattle than had been the order of the day in years past.

The study of carcass traits and performance led them to the Emulous line, and more specifically to the Murray Corbin herd at Tishomingo, Oklahoma. The herd was purchased in its entirety in 1969.






**EQUITY FUNDING OF CALIFORNIA** In 1969, Ankony was

purchased by Equity Funding of California. Ankony now had units at Highmore, S.D.; Bloomfield, lowa; Nursery, Texas; and Grand Junction, Colo. From these divisions came the Grand Champion Bull at the 1971, 1972,1973 and 1974 National Western Stock Shows.

the sale of Ankony once again, this time to international industrialist Dr. Armand Hammer. founder of Occidental Petroleum. Dr. Hammer knew the value of the Ankony herd and wasted no time in purchasing it. The name "Ankony Shadow Isle" was christened, and the Ankony program was full speed

The winning ways of the Ankony show herd continued in Denver on the hill and in the yards through the 1980s. A strong commercial bull market in the West strengthened their position. Typical of the Ankony tradition, a major move was coming.

### **BRINGS QUALITY HERD BULL**

In 1982, in search of a herd bull Hammer became interested in the much publicized Auburn Test Station champion, Lovana, owned by Virgil Lovell, Clarkesville, Ga. This intensely bred Emulous bull carried a heavy concentration of Murray Corbinblood whose herd Ankony had purchased nearly 15 years before. Lovana was purchased from the Georgia firm for a record valuation of \$1.35 million. It has proven time and time again to be one of the wisest investments Ankony Angus ever made. Lovana indeed followed in the footsteps of his predecessor, Ankonian Dynamo, with blanket acceptance throughout the breed.

### Lovana

Lovana was one of the most influential common denominators in the Ankony of unique merit and pedigree, Dr. Program as well as in the Angus breed. He sold for \$1.3million in 1982.




### **DR. ARMAND HAMMER PASSES AWAY**

In December 1990, the world lost one of its most influential leaders and dedicated Angus breeders with the death of Dr. Armand Hammer. The Ankony herd was to remain intact as Virgil Lovell, a Georgia cattleman-businessman, stepped forward and fulfilled a boyhood dream of "some day owning Ankony". He not only purchased the Ankony herd, but also the name, trademarks and the Minatare Ranch facilities. It would be hard to have picked a buyer to carry on the great Ankony name with more enthusiasm and respect than Virgil Lovell.

During the 70s and through the 80s, Mr. Lovell was involved in breeding some of the most valuable and winningest cattle in the country involving Angus, Chianina, Brangus, Salers and Charolais. He was responsible for breeding two National Grand and Reserve Salers females, the Grand Champion Bull at the 10th Anniversary World Show and the Brangus Sire of the Year in 1986 and 1987. Also, three National Grand and three Reserve Charolais females, twice Premier Breeder and Exhibitor, two National Grand Champion Bulls and National Reserve Grand, and the highest averaging sale in the modern history of the Charolais breed. His Angus operation was responsible for sales that were always in the top five gross and average from 1979 through 1984 and was in the top three on our nationally competitive

The new Ankony had broad purebred and commercial acceptance. Bulls for the commercial man and Ankonian seedstock were sought across the country. The Ankonian name continued in the pedigree of many successful Angus breeding cattle. Ankony, during this short time period, merchandised in excess of \$11,000,000 worth of cattle. Ankony exhibited the Reserve Grand Pen and Carloads in Denver in 1994 and 1995.





From boyhood, Virgil Lovell has been a student of pedigrees. He has always followed the Ankony program closely.

### SPRING CLEAN YOUR RECORD KEEPING

With snow still a possibility in many parts of the country, it may be hard to believe, but the official start of spring is here, and with it comes the season to declutter. This year, spring cleaning doesn't have to be limited to your closets and junk drawers; with the help of the American Angus Association® you can also tackle your filing cabinets.

Electronically stored registration papers can save space, time and

Spring Clean

Spending hours looking for lost registration papers can be a thing of the past. Members who opt-in to the system can access their registration certificates with the most up-to-date EPDs through their AAA Login.

If a printed copy is required for a sale or check-in at a show, members can request one be printed and mailed to

them by going to My Herd - Registration Certificate - Request Printed Registration Paper in their AAA Login or by emailing angus@angus. org. There is no charge for this service.

Along with saving space in your office, e-storage can streamline many processes. Transfers can be completed online within one day and without a postage fee. Corrections to registrations can also be submitted and processed electronically.

If this seems like the type of time and space-saving spring cleaning

you'd like to implement this year, there are two ways to get started. For new registrations, members can opt-in to e-storage through their AAA Login. Members will find the option under My Account -Registration Certificate Storage Preference. It is a one-time opt-in for all future registrations. However, members can override the option at the time of registration if needed.

The second option is where we really tackle the decluttering. If you'd

like to move your entire herd online, simply mail your paper copies to the office to be uploaded to your AAA Login for future access at no charge.

Currently, more than two-thirds of all annual registrations are e-stored, with more members adopting in to the process each year.

The American Angus Association® is also actively working to reduce

paper usage and streamline other services. Along with e-storing registration certificates, members can enroll in paperless billing and our newest feature, automatic dues renewal. These options and more information about them can be found under My Account in your AAA Login.

### INVENTORY REPORTING

Angus breeders have been committed to data collection for decades. The Angus Herd Improvement Records (AHIR) program was established in 1958 and was one of the first programs of its kind in the beef industry. Historically, data reported to AHIR was on an individual calf basis, however, over the last several years the AHIR program has expanded to add Inventory Reporting, which is a whole herd reporting system.

There are two levels in Inventory Reporting: Cow Inventory and Maternal Plus. Cow Inventory is the first level of Inventory Reporting and MaternalPlus is a step up from the Cow Inventory level, requiring a few additional records to be reported. Participants can qualify for Maternal Plus after one year of successful enrollment at the Cow Inventory level.

The purpose of these two options within Inventory Reporting is to collect annual production records for each female in the herd. These production records would include one of three things: calf record, reason code explaining why a female did not have a calf, or disposal code if a female left the herd. Herds earning MaternalPlus in Inventory Reporting report calf weaning records and heifer breeding information in addition to the cow production records.

Inventory Reporting aids members in maintaining accurate, complete records of the females in their inventory and provides valuable data to the Association. The data collected from Inventory Reporting is essential in characterizing reproductive efficiency, such as heifer pregnancy and functional cow longevity. Without the complete production records provided by Inventory Reporting, developing and

maintaining selection tools, such as EPDs, would be very difficult. Since the data from Inventory Reporting is directly benefitting the development of the Functional Longevity EPD, herds enrolled in the program will receive the research EPD on their enrolled females.

Complete herd records represent every calf born in the herd, which at the end of the day will give better credit to how the calves perform compared to their contemporaries. If performance records were only recorded for the best calves in the herd, then they would not receive proper credit for performing well because they are not being compared to the calves who may not perform as well. This unintentional bias can lead to the EPDs not being the best representation of the genetic potential of those animals and inaccurate ratios.

Enrolling in Inventory Reporting does not change how members submit data to the Association. Data can still be submitted using whichever method is preferred (Login, AIMS, spreadsheets, or paper). Participants can submit data throughout the year to meet the requirements of the program, but enrolled herds are required once a year to complete a reenrollment. During reenrollment, participants will complete any missing records and determine their inventory for the upcoming year.

Enrollment is completed on AAA Login where a complete list of the participating herd's females enrolled in the program is available. The enrollment fee is \$2 per female, which will waive the \$3 AHIR processing fee for submission of weights for the calves born that year to enrolled females. There are two enrollment periods: November 1 through January 15 and May 1 through July 15. Generally, spring calving herds enroll

in the January enrollment period and fall calving herds tend to opt for the July enrollment period.

Members enrolled in Inventory Reporting demonstrate a strong dedication to data reporting. At the end of the January enrollment, there were 137,645 females representing 900 herds enrolled in Inventory Reporting. Of those females enrolled in Inventory Reporting, 105,833 females represent the 595 members who currently have earned the Maternal Plus designation.

With the July enrollment guickly approaching, now is a good time for members in that enrollment to start thinking about completing any loose ends of records that may be missing. For members enrolled in the January enrollment, now is a great time to start submitting spring calving records and record females who may not have calved or have been culled from the herd. 💋


