




Of the 100+ units of semen selling, two units of FF Rito Ambitious brought the top price of \$900.00 per unit.







AT ITS CORE,

the New York Angus Association was established with Angus cattle producers in mind. The NYAA aims to promote New York Angus breeders, members and affiliates while also participating in national programs run by the American Angus Association, according to the NYAA.

With a membership that spans the state – from small family farms to larger commercial operations – the association wants to benefit Angus producers with all types of operations, according to the NYAA.

"Having registered cattle, I want to support our local association because, ultimately, they're designed to benefit the members," said Erica Siler, NYAA

member and owner of Yankee Beef. "AFTER WE STARTED RAISING ANGUS CATTLE, JOINING THE ASSOCIATION WAS AN OBVIOUS CHOICE."

The NYAA is evolving to meet the diverse needs of its members through a rebranding initiative that reflects a commitment to growth and improvement, Siler said.

"As a National Junior Angus Association member, I always had a passion for leadership and wanting to make things better," said Gabby Glenister, NYAA secretary. "After I began working with the association in December 2021, the rebranding and refreshed

website were always in the back of my mind." Glenister first presented the idea and concept of rebranding to the board last fall, starting with the magazine, the New York Angus Journal, which published its inaugural issue in spring 2024, she said.

The association recognized its old website was outdated and not user-friendly, prompting the need for an upgrade to enhance member engagement, Glenister said. Following the magazine's launch, Glenister introduced a new logo and a refreshed website to complement the rebrand, she said.

"Now that we have the foundation laid down, the next step in the website design is adding an e-commerce option for members to pay their membership and advertising fees online with a credit card," she said.

Recognizing few producers have the resources to create their own websites, the NYAA also plans

to incorporate a page on the NYAA site where breeders can showcase their cattle operations without the need for an individual website, Glenister said.

We have an excellent president in Chad Hazekamp, who's been a big catalyst for the rebrand, Glenister said. "He's been incorporating new sales and events and has been friendly and inviting to members, new and old."

While the Angus community in New York may be small, the producers remain resiliaint and supportive, Siler said. Currently, the community is in a unique position, with many members aging out and a new generation stepping in, Siler said. While change can be intimidating, the younger members are genuinely invested and that's exactly what we need, Siler said.

"IT'S IMPORTANT TO HAVE A GOOD MIX OF PRODUCERS ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS **BECAUSE THEY'RE THE ONES DRIVING THE WAY** THE ASSOCIATION IS GOING," SAID NICOLE **TOMMELL, NYAA MEMBER AND OWNER OF MMT** CATTLE INCORPORATED. "IF YOU DON'T HAVE A **GOOD MIX OF PEOPLE AT THE STATE LEVEL, THE ASSOCIATION WILL START TO DRIVE ITSELF IN A DIRECTION THAT MIGHT NOT BE THE BEST FOR** THE WHOLE."

Despite the progress, the Angus community in New York is not without its struggles, Tommell added. Producers trying to market cattle in New York face several because challenges the lingering associated stigma

with the region physical and location, Tommell said.

"I remember when I was in college I went to Des Moines

for a meeting, and people said to me, 'Oh, you're from New York? There's agriculture in New York?" Tommell said. "This perception has been around for 100 years, and many people outside New York and New England believe the quality of cattle here is poor."

As a result, New York producers often don't receive the recognition they deserve, Tommell said.

"I doubt people are looking to New York for show heifers for national shows," Tommell said. "It's not where you'd go to find your next champion."

The association organizes biannual sales in November and May to assist members in marketing their cattle amid strong competition, said Matt Kelley, NYAA director and owner of Hawks Hill Farm.

"Marketing cattle west of the Mississippi is always tough," Kelley said. "We aim to help our members with smaller operations market their cattle by putting together a sale of consignments from various farms."

The NYAA is always trying to benefit its members by putting together new initiatives for producers to take advantage of, Kelley said.

The NYAA is launching a new bull and heifer development program in partnership with Erwindale Farms in Waterloo, New York, as an opportunity for NYAA members to have their cattle sent to a custom feeding operation, wrote Chad Hazekamp, NYAA president, in a letter to association members.

"Many of us do not have the proper room or facilities to properly develop our bull or heifer calves," Hazekamp wrote. "It's hard to keep everyone separated, and maybe

> it's difficult to feed different diets to mature cows, firstcalf heifers, developing bulls and developing heifers."

This initiative addresses the challenges members face in properly developing calves, Hazekamp wrote. Erwindale Farms will


> optimize growth for breeding bulls and replacement heifers with evaluations, including ultrasound data and breeding soundness exams for bulls, he added.

"I don't have anything to send this year," Siler said. "But, I think it'll be interesting to see how the genetics of the New York Angus community stack up against each other."

Amid the struggles New York cattle producers face, the region also offers distinct advantages that can outweigh these challenges, Siler said.

"We in this region grow high-quality feed for incredibly cheap, and we are not forced to graze cattle on hundreds of acres of subpar or averagequality forage," Siler said. "That's a huge deal when you can grow your own feeds."

Additionally, the proximity to a large urban market gives beef producers access to a broad customer

base to sell their products to, Siler added.

The tight-knit community of Angus breeders remains supportive of each other through each failure and success, Tommell said.

"Overall, there is a camaraderie in the Angus community, and we have a good group of leaders pushing forward as a breed association in New York," Tommell said. "As a whole, it's pretty strong and we have good support."

AS THE NYAA NAVIGATES THIS PERIOD OF GROWTH AND TRANSFORMATION. THE COMMITMENT TO SUPPORTING ITS MEMBERS REMAINS AT THE FOREFRONT OF ITS MISSION, GLENISTER SAID. With a renewed focus on innovation and community engagement, the association is set to redefine the perception of New York's Angus cattle, reinforcing the resilience and unity of its breeders for years to come, Siler said. 💆

COOK: Transfer seared roast to slow cooker. Add all remaining ingredients; set to low heat. Cover, cook on low for 8 hours.

SERVE: Roast is fully cooked when it can be pierced by a fork with no resistance. Shred beef using two forks and discard any large pieces of fat.
